ABOUT THE FACULTY OF HEALTH SCIENCES

The Faculty of Health Sciences comprises three schools:

- Allied Health
- Behavioural and Health Sciences
- Nursing, Midwifery and Paramedicine

There are currently approximately 14,000 students (EFTSL) and 520 (FTE) staff in the faculty under the disciplines: occupational therapy, speech pathology, social work, exercise science, exercise physiology, nutrition science, biomedical science, nursing, midwifery, paramedicine, physiotherapy, psychology and public health. The Faculty is represented across seven ACU campuses.

The Faculty's current research priorities focus on Cardiovascular Disease and Metabolism, Health Services Research, Nutrition, Sports Performance and Rehabilitation, Psychology and Mental Health.

An expanding portfolio of postgraduate courses is also available in coursework and research. Many postgraduate courses within the Faculty have been developed in conjunction with industries in order to meet specific needs of the professions and industry. Some postgraduate units are offered in flexible learning mode by online study. All students have professional and clinical experience that is supervised by specially qualified practitioners. This position may be full-time from the North Sydney campus or a hybrid of two part-time positions from both North Sydney and Melbourne campuses.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Experience - Demonstrated excellence in tertiary teaching and curriculum development. Knowledge - Capacity to teach in broad range of food and nutrition-related areas that may include food science, food safety, innovative food product development, culinary nutrition science. Experience - Evidence of significant (Level C) leadership in academic coordination and service roles. Qualification - Accredited Practising Dietitian (with Dietitians Australia) Qualification - Professional registration (e.g., NSA, AIFST). Knowledge - Significant engagement (Level C)/Engagement (Level B) in scholarship of teaching and learning.
Core Competencies:	 Demonstrate confidence and courage in achieving ACU's Mission, Vision and Values by connecting the purpose of one's work to ACU's Mission, Vision and Values. Understand the business environment in which ACU operates and adopt a university-wide point of view to seize opportunities and improve commercial viability.
