ABOUT FACULTY OF THEOLOGY & PHILOSOPHY

The Faculty of Theology and Philosophy is the largest Faculty of its kind in Australia, comprised of two national schools - the School of Theology and the School of Philosophy - and the Institute for Religion and Critical Inquiry

ACU has prioritised research intensification and has developed a strategy designed to achieve excellence in a number of areas of strategic priority, including theology and philosophy. The outcome has been a remarkable transformation in the research standing of the University. In the 2023 QS ranking in Theology, Divinity and Religious studies, for example, ACU was ranked first in Australia, and top 50 in the world. Our Philosophy program also continues to rank highly in Australian assessments: for example, at 'above world standard' in the most recent Excellence in Research for Australia rankings. The School of Theology has a presence on every ACU campus, offering learning opportunities informed by innovative and responsive curriculum design, and internationally recognised research expertise. SELECTION CRITERIA

Qualifications, skills, knowledge and experience:

- Qualification Doctorate by Research (PhD) in Islamic theology, law and/or qur'anic exegesis, or an equivalent qualification.
- Knowledge Advanced understanding of current issues in Islamic scholarship, Muslim-Catholic relations and inter-religious dialogue.
- Knowledge Understanding of the writings of Said Nursi, with a particular focus on Fethullah Gülen and the Hizmet movement.
- Experience Evidence of excellence and innovation in curriculum design, review and renewal, including leadership in this area, especially as related to Islamic scholarship, Muslim-Catholic relations and interreligious dialogue.
- Experience Evidence of high-quality, innovative teaching (in English language), informed by reflective practice at undergraduate and/or post-graduate levels, using a variety of delivery methods (including online), including evidence of leadership in this area.
- Experience Track record of publication in leading international journals and presses in areas relevant to the position, and of effective
